First—A new Society president will be installed at the Orthopaedic Symposium March 5, 2000. Ken Lorenz '57 has been on the clinical faculty since 1963 after completion of his residency at the White Memorial Hospital in Los Angeles. He has good ideas and will bring a new approach.

Second—The number of life members continues to grow, having almost doubled

in the past two years. The interest from this fund earned in 1999 (\$1,709), is now a major source of funding for the Society. Each of you is encouraged to start the life membership three-year program of \$500 annually. Call the Society's manager of finance, Karen Sutton, and have the charge put on your credit card. Third—The new book *An Incredible Journey: Orthopaedic Surgery at Loma Linda University in the Twentieth Century* has been submitted to the printer. Your name is in it and you will be thrilled to own several of them to share with colleagues, classmates, family and employees. Order them now for

Fourth—We have a strong department under the leadership of William Bunnell, MD. The department has received national press as being one of the top fifty orthopaedic surgery centers of the country, but the local medical and university communities need to be better informed. Executive Director Dennis Park and the board have a plan to get the word out and the book will help. The Society and the department are pre-purchasing copies that will be given to the administration and the chairmen. Donors are being asked to provide each of the University Councilors and the Loma Linda University Board of Trustees with a copy. Copies will be distributed to medical societies and teaching hospitals in Southern California and to SDA colleges and academies nation wide. We

In the last decade, Neufeld Society life memberships have increased from a total

of six in 1990 to thirty-one as of February 17, 2000. This increase is encouraging to the Neufeld Society Board of Directors inasmuch as life memberships provide the much-needed financial base from which the society can operate. At the end of each year, interest earned from life memberships is transferred to the operating revenue. In 1999, \$2,281.53 was earned in interest and this was transferred to the operating revenue in January 2000. This amount does not sound like much, but yet is important because it represents one fourth of the operating expenses.

As earlier mentioned, life memberships

provide a much-needed base, and it is our goal to increase the base (life memberships) to a level where we do not have to rely on annual dues as the main source of the operating revenue.

To accomplish this goal, the Board of Directors would like to encourage those of you who are not life members to become life members in the year 2000. As an incentive, the Board of Directors voted to give to those who become life members in 2000, the new book entitled *An Incredible Journey: Orthopaedic Surgery at Loma Linda University in the 20th Century*. (A \$35 value). Edited by our current Neufeld Society President, Robert L. Horner '53-A, this book is one you will be proud to have in your library.

To make the incentive even greater the

Board of Directors encourages you to take advantage of the life membership payment plan. You may pay the \$1,500 life membership over a three-year period. cellence in academy and college, Fellow was accepted in the freshman class of 1951 at LLUSM.

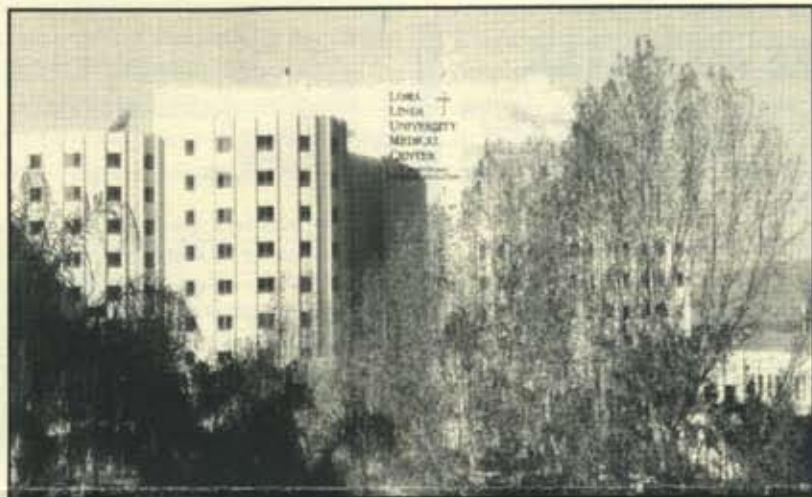
During his junior year he met Hilde Koch, a fresh-
